

Nov. 2, 1955

Tribute Paid to Historic Watertown Plank Road in Milwaukee Ceremonies

They paid tribute to the memory of a road Tuesday afternoon. The road receiving the

somewhat unusual honor is the old Watertown Plank road, which, just a century ago, was the main thoroughfare between Milwaukee and Watertown.

Its white oak planks stretched westward from Milwaukee through Elm Grove and Goerke's Corners, along Hwy. SS to Pewaukee, then along the route of old Hwy. 16 through Hartland, Okauchee, and Oconomowoc.

Tuesday afternoon, a plaque marking the route of the planked road was unveiled. The aluminum plaque, 24x36 inches in size and erected by the Milwaukee County Historical society, is located at the northwest corner of the darkbricked Miller Inn at Milwaukee's Miller Brewery.

Nearby is a hillside replica of Frederick Miller's old "Plank road brewery," past which the Watertown road originally ran.


